This beautiful girl with sparkling green eyes is Kara. Kara is one of AAC's great success stories. She arrived from an overcrowded shelter with a bad case of *demodex*, a non-contagious mange that can be worsened by stress. Kara looked older than her 8 months, and had lost large areas of fur. The vet said it was the worst case of *demodex* she'd ever seen. Just looking at Kara would break your heart.

Luckily, we had a fantastic foster family willing to take Kara home while she recovered. After six months in a loving, stressfree environment she began to regain her health and trust in humans. Soon she was ready for adoption!

This is when we met the Millers, a lovely family with two teenage children and a playful dog named Blaze. They were looking for another dog, and adopted Kara to complete their family. As sometimes happens, Kara and Blaze needed a little help to learn how to live together peacefully, but an AAC donor paid for a trainer to work with the Millers. After one productive session they had the tools they needed to help Kara, Blaze, and the rest of the family get along.



It's been almost two years since the Millers adopted Kara and we hear from them often. Here is what Kara's mom has to say: "Kara is doing great! She is your typical, spoiled, happy dog. She remains demodex-free, with beautiful, soft fur. Everyone compliments her temperament and behavior. Of course, she still has times when she's stubborn, but we just review her basic training and she's fine afterward. She's a good girl, and a wonderful companion for our family. Thank you for bringing her into our lives. They wouldn't be the same without her!"

For those of you who have already donated—thank you! Your support helps to keep our animals safe, healthy, and loved. It also helps us keep the lights on,

the AC running, and the front door open. We've made some changes at the shelter, some of which will help to cut expenses, and others to increase revenue.

#### STAFFING

After careful planning, we've reduced payroll by 30%.

Most of the employees you're familiar with are still at the shelter, but we've worked with them to create a schedule that makes the best use of their time.

#### **HOURS**

We've also changed our hours of operations. We're now open 1:00 PM—8:00 PM, 7 days a week. This allows us to complete more adop-

tions in the evening when people are home from work. It also provides extra time for volunteers to offer enrichment activities and support for our animals.

#### GOING FORWARD

We will continue our efforts to reduce expenses and increase efficiency. We're making pro-

#### **SOCIALIZATION**

Our volunteers take time to visit, play, and walk with our animals. This important work helps to socialize our residents and improves their chances of finding a home.



#### TRAINING

at the end of a walk to teach our dogs helpful behaviors. Learning things like "sit", "stay", and "wait", help our dogs make good impressions on potential adopters, and increase their chances of finding a home. AAC volunteers help to make this happen. Well-behaved dogs get adopted quickly!



#### **SUPPORT**

Our PetPal program teams volunteers with animals to provide enrichment activities and promotion to help find homes. Social media and personal networks make a difference!
