Here is an update on our wonderful alumnus, Nero. You may remember we found this sweet eightmonth-old Cane Corso at a local overcrowded shelter in December 2013. We simply fell in love with his sweet face and gentle demeanor. After just a few days in our shelter, Nero became seriously ill with sudden onset pneumonia and required IV antibiotics, nebulizer treatments, and an extended 🅻 stay at a 24-hour emergency care animal hospital. He was put on oxygen as he could not breathe on his own. We set up a donation page and many people in our community stepped up to help us fund Nero's very expensive, round-the-clock medical care. We all called it a 'Christmas miracle' when Nero pulled through against the odds. He went on to be adopted by a wonderful family, who has given Nero the happy ending he deserved.

His family reports: "Nero is a sweetie. He loves to check on everyone in the house at night; and absolutely loves it when all our kids are home from college. He loves to run, play and swim -- but also loves to curl up with people -- he thinks he's a lap dog!! I've also discovered that if I get out of bed, he'll be quick to "steal" my spot and then pretend to be asleep when I tell him to get down or move over. We couldn't imagine life without Nero." Nero's family returned this June to adopt a beautiful cat named Cody, who they say "is Nero's best friend." Nero and Cody's family recently sent us an update saying "Thank you AAC for all you did for Nero and Cody. Expanding our family with rescue animals has brought so much love into our home."
